Several area organizations such as Scouts, a neighboring preschool, firefighters, and Topeka Center for Peace & Justice hosted booths at the carnival to provide engaging activities and helpful information. The congregation reached out to local schools and passed out flyers in the neighborhood to advertise the event. Almost everyone from the congregation was involved in some fashion, from planning, creating games, designing flyers, providing donations, staffing booths, making phone calls, and much more. Participants created a peace sign medallion necklace and stamped their hand on our peace banner. An estimated 250 people attended the carnival!
